## Welcome Home

My son recently told me a story that is going around his college campus regarding a student who hitched a ride home at the end of the semester. Students usually display large signs with their destinations printed in bold letters. Despite the intense competition for rides, one student got a lift almost as soon as he held up his sign. It said, "Mom's waiting."

This college student utilized one of the most profound and most enduring loves, the love of home. Home is one of the largest words in our emotional vocabulary. "Home," as Robert Frost said, "is the place where, when you have to go there, they have to take you in."

It is well documented that birds have homing instincts. There is also evidence to suggest that we human beings also possess a homing instinct as well. For centuries, our people wandered down the drafty corridors of history carrying a love for the land of Israel and a hope of returning to the home of our origins. We echo that hope in our daily prayers and "home" is the direction we face when we offer those prayers. Indeed Israel is the place where a Jew feels at home even though he has never been there before.

The homing instinct works upon Jews in other ways. It helps to bring many an alienated Jew back to our people. In our congregation, there are countless examples of individuals, within whom was present a latent spark that grew strong enough, leading that person to find a way back home.

I think of a senior adult who had not been involved in communal Jewish life since his young adulthood. After some 40 years of absence, he found his spiritual home at Kol Emet. Because of Torah study, regular Shabbat

attendance, and volunteering for our congregational family, this man feels great to be “home.” Others who never had a Jewish education as children feel that same instinct, inspired by the blessings of parenthood, and have journeyed home and found that connection with our people again.

Adults and children alike were taken in by the ugly extra-terrestrial creature whose vocabulary consisted of a single word – “home.” E.T. touched so many of us, because like E.T., we too long for home. Homesickness can make us feel unsettled even when we feel secure in our own terrestrial home.

Twenty-five years ago, the residents of Lower Makefield felt the inspiration to establish Congregation Kol Emet, as a response to that communal longing. They had the opportunity to offer others the chance to come “home.” Thankfully, over the years, hundreds of families and individuals seeking friendship, warmth, community, and support of a source of Jewish identity have entered our doors. Each of you, in your own way, has strengthened the foundation of Kol Emet – our Jewish home.

As a member of the Kol Emet family, I hope that you will want to come and share the nachas (pride) of 25 wonderful years. We have put together an anniversary celebration that will remind each person why you came home and why you’ll never want to be homeless again. Take a look in this issue of the Voice and sign up for as many activities as you can to commemorate our anniversary weekend of March 20th and March 21st.

It will be my privilege, on the occasion of Congregation Kol Emet’s 25th anniversary to say to you, in person, welcome to Kol Emet – welcome HOME!

It has always been my personal goal to continually improve and grow our schools. From our youngest children who are barely two years old, to our oldest young adults who are almost legal, we want the very best in educational standards, values, and environment. It is my responsibility to decide what makes a successful school.

Gleaning information from a comprehensive cross-country survey, Dr. Jack Wertheimer, a noted Jewish educator, pinpointed what makes a successful school. He noted the following:

- School staff should be welcoming, attentive and appreciative of their students.
- There must be a balance of Jewish learning and Jewish living in our families.

- Students should be taught in a pedagogical appropriate and challenging level of learning.
- There must be an emphasis on personal interactions with both students and families.
- The school understands and views itself as part of the whole congregational community.
- There is a maximum use of time to achieve quality learning.

I share this with you because we continuously evaluate our school and the needs of our community. Of the 180 families who send children to our school, 100 families replied to the monkey survey. Thank you so very much – your insight was extremely helpful in helping us decide what direction we will journey to in the years to come. Our first and main goal that many families hoped for was a sense of community for their children. Our staff is already engaged in this improvement. We have implemented “study buddies” in some of our classes, other classes are exchanging phone numbers to make new friends, and our older classes chat on Facebook. Our students are having social gatherings outside of the school, and that is just great! If you have any suggestions or ideas, please share them with us. We are always willing to hear new suggestions that will improve our school.

Along these lines, our Confirmation “think-tank” has had a tremendous impact with the help of Debra Brozan of the Auerbach Central Agency for Jewish Education (ACAJE). We will shortly present a proposal for our Confirmation curriculum that will include weekend retreats, service-learning projects and a new Confirmation format.

It is because of your energy, interest and care that we continue to explore and experiment, bringing success to our school. As Dr. Wertheimer said, we are striving for “the very best standards in Jewish education.”
