Remember

On May 19th and 20th, we will celebrate the festival of Shavuot. This holiday celebrates the most important event in Jewish history – the giving of the Torah. One of the traditions on Shavuot is to have a Yiskor service. This is an opportunity to remember our loved ones, those special people in our lives whom are no longer with us; parents, grandparents, siblings, spouses, and children, who gave our lives meaning and helped shape who we are, and anchor us to our past and our roots.

The following true story by Rabbi Benjamin Blech is a sad portrayal of the losses that families and communities suffer and that could be prevented with a little caring.

I was browsing for an item of Jewish interest in an antique store in lower Manhattan. What I found made me weep. But soon I realized that tears were not enough. It was then that I vowed to tell this story, to ensure that nothing like it happens again.

You see, I was a witness to a murder. Not the murder of a person. No, perhaps something more horrible. The murder of memory. The callous, cruel indifference to the most important message of our traditions and especially the holiday of Passover.

What I spotted in that store was a Seder plate that I immediately recognized. How could I not? It was the focus of my eulogy for Sam, a survivor of Auschwitz. What a tale it had been. The Germans rounded up all the Jews in his little town for deportation. Others may have believed the grand lie that they were merely being transported to another site to be used for labor. Sam was too smart for that. He knew they would be murdered. He believed Hitler and understood that the Nazis wanted to eliminate every Jew as well as every reminder of their heritage. So he did what he could to save some reminder of his precious Jewish heritage.

How he wanted to save Torah scrolls and the silver from the Holy Ark. But he had so little time and he could dig a hole only so big. Sam buried one item: his family's beautiful silver Passover Seder plate, passed down from generation to generation.

So 50 paces from his favorite tree in his back yard, Sam hid the Seder plate. He called the tree "his Etz Chaim", his "tree of life". If he survived and could return to his home and find his Seder plate, he would have foiled the German plan to destroy every remnant of Judaism.

Sam could never explain how he and all of his family and friends survived. In his heart he believed that because of his buried Seder plate and his "tree of life" the 2 things he thought about every day, that his holy mission was to save and cherish the traditions of our people, and this kept him alive.

After the war, Sam went back to his town, returned to his home, dug up his Seder plate, and lived to celebrate dozens of Passovers with his Seder plate until he died.

You know what I am about to tell you. Rabbi Blech was in an antique store – he recognized the Seder plate, on sale in the shop! “Where was it from?” he asked the storeowner.

“Oh it was part of an estate sale by the children.” “You see” the storeowner said, “he was religious but his children were not – they don’t really have any need for items like these.” The buried treasure of the past had become the discarded trash of the generation that followed.

How I wish that story was rare. But I have seen too often that we live in an age that doesn’t understand the meaning of memory. We live in an age of unsentimental disregard for the past.

How many prayer books and bibles, some with Yahrzeit dates and histories of families inscribed in them have been dropped off in synagogues, all over the country, because the people who inherited these sacred objects had no use for them and no desire to clutter their homes with old dusty books and memorabilia?

“Unless we remember,” the English novelist Edward Morgan Foster put it, “we cannot understand.” Our passions, whether they be books or furniture, items of Judaica possess the unique ability of stirring up memories that keep alive those whom we deeply loved.

I ask that you treasure and value the meaning and the memories of the sacred possessions that are in your keeping. Whether it is a Seder plate like Sam’s, candlesticks, or a menorah. Our loved ones taught us, nurtured us, sustained us, and left us with memories.

“Remember,” the bible commands us, because memory is the secret to eternal life. It is why we have survived throughout the ages. It is how our parents and other loved ones live on in us, even as we hope that we will live on in the hearts of our children and descendants.

On Thursday morning, May 20th, the second day of Shavuot, we will have a Yizkor service during the morning Minyan. It will be a holy time to remember loved ones and friends, those who gave us joy and happiness. It is also time to remember the Torah, the source of Jewish life and learning.

May we treasure all of our possessions, the physical and spiritual, what they mean to us and what they can offer our children. May we reclaim our lost possessions and hope that we will live lives worthy of being remembered.

Mortgage Debt Reduction Program

L'Dor V'Dor - From generation to generation. It is our obligation and a basic Jewish tenet to take the vision of our founders who created this building and go forward to ensure our children have a Jewish center of activity including, education, prayer, and social activities.

As a follow up to the Congregational Meeting on Sunday, January 31st, 2010, I am pleased to announce that we have listened to your ideas and positive feedback from my presentation and will initiate a Mortgage Debt Reduction Program.

The purpose of this program is to help reduce our only LONG TERM DEBT, our mortgage, which is currently \$940,000 at a 5.25% interest rate and carries a monthly expense of \$10,700. We have approximately 9 years left on this mortgage. Our goal is to reduce this debt as quickly as possible. If we pay an additional \$1,000 per month, we cut 10 months off the mortgage and save \$22,000 in interest expense. An additional \$2,000 per month, we cut 19 months of payments and \$40,000 of interest expense.

We need to act strategically for our future and create fiscal soundness so that we can meet future obligations as they become necessary for the maintenance, growth, and well-being of our synagogue.

The Mortgage Debt Reduction Program is VOLUNTARY. Please consult your tax advisor for potential tax benefits.

The program works like this:

- All congregants will be solicited for a monthly donation of any amount. (Suggested: \$18, \$36, \$54, \$72, \$118)
- All monies collected will be set up in a Mortgage RESTRICTED account, and will be applied as an EXTRA principal payment (in addition to our scheduled monthly mortgage payment). The intent of the program is that all monies collected will be used to pay down the principal balance of the mortgage. However, the Board reserves the right to use the monies collected towards the

monthly mortgage payment should circumstances dictate. All participants will receive notice in such event.

- A full and comprehensive review of the Mortgage Debt Program will take place annually.
- These monthly donations are open-ended and can be terminated at your request at any time.
- All payments can be an automatic credit card payment, an ACH Debit Bank Card transaction, monthly checks, semi-annual payment, or yearly payment. We will work with you based on how you want to pay for this donation.

Enclosed you will find an agreement form for your consideration. Please participate based on your ability and your love for Kol Emet and know that your donation is much appreciated by our community.

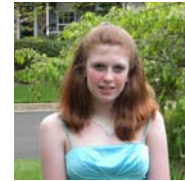
